TMLRA President's Column for January 2009 SS

Hope all of you had a successful hunting season and spent quality time with family during the holiday season. We had a good shoot in October. Jim and Charlie put on another good auction, which resulted in lots of prizes on the table come Sunday's awards. Thanks to all of the donors and buyers. It has been suggested that TMLRA put a portion of the auction proceeds into the Capital Improvement Fund each year. The Board will decide on that come June. As of this date, the Capital Improvement Fund has a \$1,381.99 balance. That is from the shotgun and shooting box give-away which was a huge success. We need to keep that going, so if anyone has an idea please let us know. A lot of us are willing to contribute parts, \$, etc. so as to not drop the whole project on 2-3 peoples' shoulders. We really need to grow this CIF as quickly as we can to preserve the existence of TMLRA should we ever be forced to break camp and move.

I have discussed the camping fees with the Lake Store Manager and with the City Utilities Director. I again contacted the Lake Store Manager who is responsible for all city activities at the Lake Area, being the marina, gun range, campsites, etc. The \$20 per night fee for RV's is set and will not be reduced. The Lake Manager again informed me that tent camping is free for TMLRA. We discussed mowing, cleanliness of the bathrooms, and availability of quality bathroom supplies. He promised to improve in those areas. I offered to collect the camp fees through the range house when shooters register however they prefer to handle the camping fees at the lake store, the same way they do for camping in the marina area. Everything in all of the recent discussions I had with the Lake Manager and the Utilities Director revolve around generating income for the lake area properties owned by the city. During the discussion, he informed me that 16 RV campers came to

the store and settled for their camping for the October Shoot. There were 24 RV campers in the camp at least for Friday and Saturday.

The city of Brady has been good to TMLRA for most of the 40 plus years that we have been here, and TMLRA has been good to Brady. City agendas and plans come and go. They currently have big plans for the lake area, and from what I can tell it is all based on potential income. I plan to have lunch with the new City Manager the week of the March shoot to basically get acquainted and discuss the future of the range area, etc. I want him to come to the range during the shoot and meet some of the finest people in the world. I'll load one up and let him shoot it. What I am getting around to saying is that whoever the lake area manager or the City Manager is, we are going to have to effectively communicate with them to maintain our Range Use Agreement. Technically speaking, we are invited visitors and don't want to give them any reason to send us packing. Some of the membership has informed me that "we have rights here" and TMLRA is a big economic boost the city's economy". Both statements are correct and TMLRA does provide an economic boost to Brady at least three times a year, every year. Now, lets be honest with ourselves; the motels, restaurants, hardware stores, gas stations, etc. appreciate our patronage but if we never came back they would certainly feel the loss but would survive it. As far as our "rights", we have rights only as far as the city officials want to extend them.

The sand on the range has really helped the ricochet problem but we have to stay on top of it to do everything possible to stop the rounds getting over the burm. The property owner just North of the spillway burm is pleased that the City and TMLRA is working together to improve the situation. TMLRA members will survive or adjust to the new camping fees. It would have better if it was \$10/night but I am thankful it's not \$30/night. Either way we have argued the point with them and I am convinced they are not budging from the \$20/night fee for RV's, at least in the near future. We do have a great facility to hold our shoots and I think we can operate a long time under the Range Use Agreement. We just need to

continue being good ambassadors for the TMLRA whether in town or when visitors show up during our shoots. Continue to inform the local businesses that you are here for the Texas Muzzleloaders shoot! Good or bad, they can and do influence the elected City officials. Wouldn't it be nice if the Brady citizens and businesses held the opinion "that those muzzleloaders are a good bunch of folks". I think the ones who know us already have that opinion. In March, the RV campers will need to stop by the Lake Store to make arrangements for your camping. Let's not mess up a good place to shoot over this camping deal, because with our current financial resources, we honestly can't afford to move anywhere unless someone deeds us some acceptable real estate.

Arizona will be descended upon by a bunch of Texas sharpshooters next month that have always represented our state well at the Winter Nationals. Good Luck to all that make the trek. Get your stuff ready for the annual Frost on the Cactus Shoot and bring a friend – gas is cheap (er) so take advantage of it. No excuse to not be here the 2nd weekend in March. Pray for good weather.

2008 was good to our family as the stork flew on September 13th and left us the best little granddaughter you ever saw, and our first grandchild. If I had known how much fun the grandchildren were, I would have had them first. Jeff also bagged two good bucks with his bow, one scored 130 5/8, the other 135 1/2 so had to mount 'em. I guess the Obstetrician and the Taxidermist had a good 2008 as well. Wish all of you a great 2009! As always, I am proud to be associated with so many good muzzleloaders and TMLRA.

Range rules

1. All matches will be fired in a single relay, except bench rest matches identified in the program.
2. Sighters are allowed in all matches.
3. Minus scores count as zero
4. N.M.L.R.A. rules shall prevail, with these exceptions
 - a. Minnie balls in musket matches.
 - b. Over 60 years of age can use any metallic sights in any match.
 - c. Muskets are allowed to have wood removed from the stock.
 - d. Targets must be completed in the relay or series of relays in which the first scoring shot is fired.
5. Rule books may be purchased at the range house.
6. Each person shall score their own targets before turning them into the Range Officer.
7. Targets will be turned in at the end of each relay.
8. All relays will be 30 minutes long.
9. Relays will begin at 8:00 a.m. No relay will begin after 5:00 p.m. The last relay on Sunday will be the relay that ends closest to noon.
10. Agg. Fees must be paid before any match in that agg is shot.
11. All buffalo guns and muskets will need to be inspected before any of those matches are shot. See the range chairman, range officer or the president.
12. Men and women must load their own gun. Assistants may not shoot for juniors.
13. No shooting jackets allowed.
14. Shooters must have their own frame. One shooter per frame.
15. Juniors under 16 may purchase matches or aggs in the under 16 years of age divisions and do not pay a \$5.00 registration fee.
16. Juniors participating in non-junior aggs must pay the registration fee.
17. Individual matches purchased do not apply toward an aggregate award unless an aggregate is purchased.
